Implications for All Educators

ELF16 is about the implications for all educators of seismic shifts in the world of work and the demand for a different mix of skills. Education is not only about preparing people for the world of work, but employment readiness and adaptability are imperatives. Laying and strengthening the foundations for transferable cognitive and social skills is a lifelong journey from early childhood.

Yesterday's Schools?

"Tomorrow's Schools" was launched over a quarter of a century ago in a world which no longer exists. In a digitised and globalised new world the nature of work is changing rapidly with huge implications for education and training.

Over the last 25 years New Zealand has seen a rise in the ratio of skilled professionals, an increase in talent mobility, a big jump in the number of women in tertiary education and the workforce and a trend of unskilled men exiting the workplace. By one estimate 40% of all jobs are threatened by automation in the next 15 years. Many jobs are less secure because they are part-time or temporary. But there are many new opportunities for those with the required attitudes and skills.
