Yesterday's Schools?

"Tomorrow's Schools" was launched over a quarter of a century ago in a world which no longer exists. In a digitised and globalised new world the nature of work is changing rapidly with huge implications for education and training.

Over the last 25 years New Zealand has seen a rise in the ratio of skilled professionals, an increase in talent mobility, a big jump in the number of women in tertiary education and the workforce and a trend of unskilled men exiting the workplace. By one estimate 40% of all jobs are threatened by automation in the next 15 years. Many jobs are less secure because they are part-time or temporary.
